

A Message from the Chairman of the School Committee

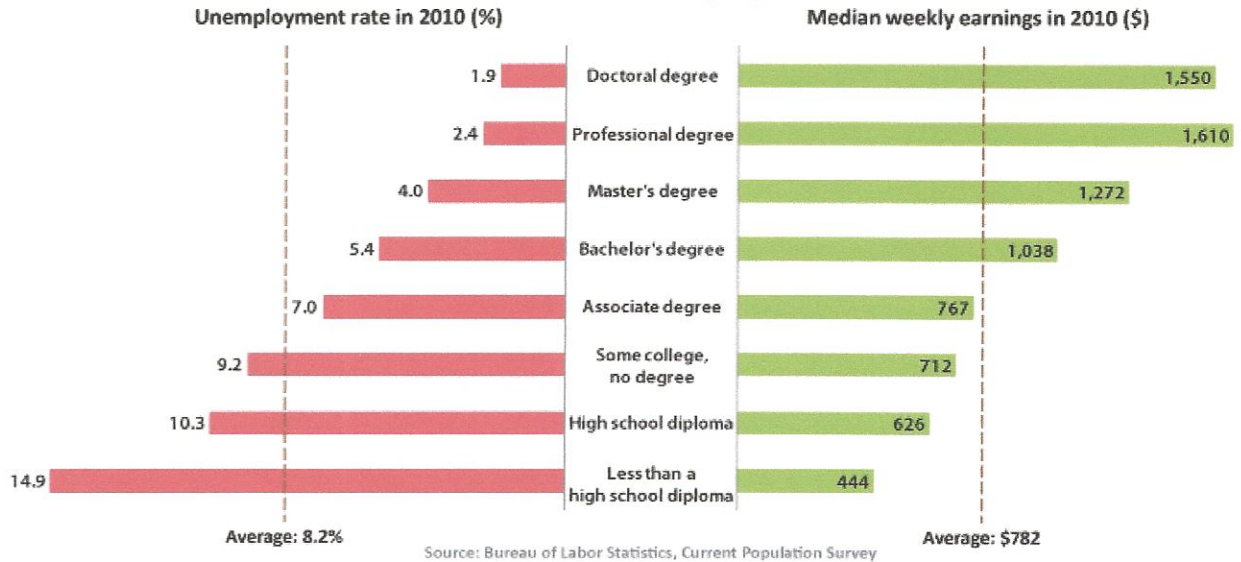
“Partners for Success”
